

VANPOOLING



Participating in a vanpool can save you lots of money on insurance benefits, reduced maintenance costs, improve the long-term value of your investment, and help you use commute time for work or leisure!

What is a Vanpool?

A vanpool is a group of people who share a similar commute schedule (from a local origin to a shared destination) commuting together in a 9 – 14 passenger van.

How does a Vanpool work?

One person in the vanpool usually volunteers to be the driver/coordinator participants in a vanpool pay a monthly fee that covers the vehicle lease, maintenance, insurance, gas, parking and tolls. The commitment for both passengers and vehicle lease is 30 days.

How does a Vanpool save \$\$\$?

- Split the cost for gas and tolls
- Reduced car maintenance
- Savings on annual car insurance costs
- Some employers also provide pre-tax benefits
- Save money through the TMA's incentive programs
